Opportunities abound for men, women and youth who seek to add an adventure element to their faith journey. Our recovery and grief-share ministries continue to facilitate encouragement, comfort and healing to all who come.

Our support for our local mission partners such as Heartbeats, The Licking County Jail Ministry, Look-Up Center and Vertical 196 is ongoing. So many of our people are stepping up to contribute, serve and take leadership roles in these local ministries, walking out our mission to Love, Live and Lead like Jesus here in Licking County. Additionally, we have taken part in disaster relief mission trips when tragedy strikes in our nation.

God continues to link our hearts with the people of Kenya. Several different teams traveled to Kenya this past summer. We were able to plant a church in an area formerly unreached by the gospel. Sixty people were baptized and hundreds were reached as we shared the good news of Jesus Christ. We conducted VBS for children and working with the Living Water ministry, we helped raise money in advance to provide water to a Village.

God is moving powerfully in our midst as we seek to impact our world for Him. I am blessed to serve as your Senior Pastor and am encouraged and inspired by the love of Jesus expressed through His people at Spring Hills.




How have volunteers supported your ministry area(s)?

This past May we said goodbye to Andrew Foltz, as he and Abby headed to Colorado to pursue other ministry callings. In August we said goodbye to long-time Saturday night worship leader Karrie Miller, as she is set to pursue other callings as well. We look forward to how God is refreshing us, retooling us, and resetting us for what He has in store in these coming days through SHBC.

We have approximately 80 volunteers who serve on our weekend worship team, including vocalists, instrumentalists, and technicians in audio, video, media, and lighting. We also have a team of 6-10 that serve each year in our Kids Choir program. Note: We are almost always in need of new members for our AVL team! Have you ever considered helping out?

Worship Ministries embrace the SHBC vision of "Building Generations for Jesus Christ." Our Kids Choir program, September - May, is developing life-long worshipers of Jesus Christ, and discovering potential young worship leaders! Our uTH Band continues the development of these growing worship leaders. We also help resource the high school age Amplify worship band. Through our worship internship program we focus on high school upper classmen and young adults who are likely to be involved in worship leading either vocationally or at least significantly in church and/or missions ministry settings.

How has your ministry area reached, touched or changed the world and supported our mission to Love, Live & Lead like Jesus?

As we continue to develop lifelong worshipers of Jesus Christ, we regularly continue to see young people who have been discipled through serving in the SHBC worship ministry, go on to callings in various places around the state of Ohio, the U.S., and around the world. We like to "spread the praise!" Music is almost always a part of our mission trips around the world. It's an international language that both breaks down barriers and lifts the Lord Jesus Christ to His rightful place. Our participation in the Granville Christmas Candlelight Walking Tour is a direct attempt to share Jesus with those who come to enjoy that beautiful evening. Our Dec. 23 services at Swasey Chapel seek to attract non-churched family, friends, and acquaintances to a service where they will hear the gospel message. Also, it is a blessing to know that many or most members of the SHBC worship team also serve in other areas of ministry and outreach.

God's great work included 232 people who accepted Jesus in their lives, 60 were baptized, 330 treated by the medical clinic, and 38 people have become member of the new church on Tulu, Kenya. In addition, we would like to thank Living Water of Ohio for building a rain water catchment for the new church. We must live, love, and lead like Jesus!



MENTORING @spring hil



A mentor is someone willing to come alongside a person at a critical time to offer a listening ear, an encouraging voice, and a guiding hand. Our mentoring leadership team is committed to being a catalyst for mentoring at Spring Hills. This team provides training and resources for mentoring, and they strive to encourage people to naturally find mentoring relationships.

We have discipleship mentors who are available to disciple new believers, general life mentors who are available to mentor on various life topics, and marriage mentors who mentor couples looking to prepare for marriage, strengthen their marriage, or repair their marriage.

Ultimately, our mentors want others to know Christ is the one who changes our lives. He makes a difference in us spiritually. He makes a difference in our marriages, and Christ makes a difference in whatever life issue we face. We have two main gatherings a year that we call Mentoring @ Spring Hills where we gather current mentors and anyone interested in mentoring for training and to equip mentors to create opportunities for mentoring.





Children of the World - International Children's Choir


Through song, dance, spoken word, and creative media, the choir presents the reality of poverty, but also the hope of change through advocacy, investment, and compassion. The choir — which represents a rich and culturally diverse set of backgrounds and experiences — includes children from World Help's Child Sponsorship Programs in Uganda, Nepal, Honduras, and the Philippines. The children have performed at venues including Focus on the Family, Brooklyn Tabernacle, Disney World, and Shadow Mountain Community Church.

Ongoing Partners here in Licking County, Ohio include: Vertical 196 Homeless Drop-In Center, Heartbeats Pro-Life Counseling Center, Young Life school-based clubs in Granville, Look Up Ministries, collegiate programs at Denison University and The Licking County Jail Incarceration Ministry.

Numerous SHBC volunteers staff and facilitate mission outreach in each of our local partners. Volunteers from our fellowship assist in numerous ways: with the clothing and baby supply closet, joining the team at the Licking County Jail by becoming a "Be-a-Friend" or becoming a chaplain in our local YMCA, or preparing and serving our weekly meal for some 90 women and men living on the street.

National partners include: H2O Ministries at Bowling Green University, Cru Missionaries - Matt and Leslie Sfura in Normal, Illinois, International Friendships Incorporated [IFI] out of Columbus, Ohio; our own Southern Baptist Associational mission staff in Cambridge, Ohio; and teaming up with Samaritan's Purse for disaster relief efforts among some of the hardest hit communities in America.

SHBC has a long history of prayerfully and financially supporting national partners like these college and young adult missions. Whether it is on our regional campuses or throughout the midwest, student-based missions is part of our DNA!



The Licking County Jail Ministries

Scott Hayes, Chaplain Licking County Jail Ministries





The Licking County Jail Ministries is a non-profit Christian organization serving the needs of inmates at the Licking County Justice Center in Newark, Ohio since its inception in 1986. The LCJM is led by a volunteer board of directors and guided by a full time chaplain and two part-time chaplains. Volunteer Driven Programs in our local facility include: spiritual counseling, crisis intervention, staff support, Be-a-Friend Programs, Bible Studies, weekend worship services and release assistance efforts. in 2018 alone some 987 Bibles have been distributed, 193 decisions for Christ have been recorded and 102 Inmates have been baptized! Worship is happening in our jail!

The LCJM also has launched a new program called Vertical 196--Homeless Daytime Drop-In Center. Vertical 196 operates five days a week offering free hot and healthy lunches, shower and laundry facilities, clothing and backpack closet, haircuts, and more! To date, SHBC has engaged over 50 individuals in consistant weekly volunteer support!

How has your ministry area linked with our vision of "Building Generations for Jesus Christ?"

God is at work in the AWANA ministry at Spring Hills. We have seen an increase in clubbers attending in the past four club seasons. Families who were not attending SHBC but bringing their children to AWANA are now attending SHBC for worship and connecting with other ministries at SHBC. The plan of salvation is being shared many times throughout the club year and children are responding in faith.

How has your ministry area reached, touched or changed the world and supported our mission to Love, Live & Lead like Jesus?

hile AWANA is a ministry focused on children, we pray that parents and leaders will also be affected by the truth that is God's unending love. It is our goal that each week hearts be forever changed with the knowledge of Jesus Christ and help lead AWANA clubbers to His saving grace. It is the mission of Awana to grow children toward an everlasting relationship with Christ.



How have volunteers supported your ministry area(s)?

We have an incredible team of volunteers! They are faithful in their attendance. They are engaged with encouraging the children. They are praying with children and parents. They are supportive to pray for team members who share prayer requests. We currently have 69 volunteers in the AWANA ministry-this includes 3 individuals on the SHBC security team.

Parents are reporting children are sharing the Gospel on the playgrounds at schools and parks through their deeper understanding of God's Word using the AWANA materials (handbooks) and hearing God's Word at club during our Bible lessons. The AWANA clubbers raised over \$1,900 in mission funds during the September 2018 - April 2019 club season. These funds supported the work done at Vertical 196 and Heartbeats as well as supporting the Kenya Mission Team. We offer a December AWANA Christmas Store where clubbers use their points they earn September thru late November to shop for Christmas gifts for their family members. They are learning the blessings of giving to others through the AWANA Christmas Store. Volunteers (parents and SHBC church members) wrap the presents the clubbers purchase so when the gifts go home, they are ready to put under their Christmas tree.



The Spring Hills Homeschool Group is a ministry of Spring Hills Baptist Church, Granville, Ohio, for families who are educating some or all of their children at home (Pre-K through High School). Our families represent many communities, educational styles, and church affiliations.

We welcome all families who desire to support each other as we undertake the joyous and challenging task of educating our children at home!

Skyview Group 2019

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

Our adult and student volunteers are the life blood of what keeps our programs running every Wednesday and Sunday. We have 8 small groups that meet on Wednesday that are led by caring and invested adult leaders. On Sunday evenings, middle school small groups are led by both an adult and a high school student leader.



This year's See You at the Pole event was one of our biggest to date. Pastor Gary, our mission's pastor, has been leading this event for well over 25 years. Under his direction we are able to take students to 7 area high schools and middle schools including our very own Granville Christian Academy. We begin the morning by having a pancake breakfast and time of prayer and conclude by traveling to area schools to pray around their flag poles.





How has your ministry area reached, touched or changed the world and supported our mission to Love, Live & Lead like Jesus?

This past Spring we sent a team of adult and students to North Carolina to help rebuild homes and to rebuild hope for residents whose homes were devastated by Hurricane Florence. Our team worked in conjunction with Samaritan's Purse to remove debris and replace drywall so that the slow process of rebuilding could start. By intentionally placing adult and student leaders together we promote communication between generations of Christ followers and often friendships that last long after the trip has concluded.

We also use student and adult leaders to co-lead small groups for our middle school group uTH (pronounced youth). This is a chance for high school students to encourage 6th-8th grade students to continue to trust Christ during the growth process. Adult leaders not only guide the middle school students, but our high school leaders have a chance to be mentored as well.

CELEBRATE RECOVERY LEADERSHIP













"Celebrate Recovery is an avenue of healing and freedom so that believers can go on and serve more effectively and bear fruit for the kingdom that will last!" - Pastor Jeff

he purpose of Spring Hills Baptist Church's "Celebrate Recovery" is to fellowship and celebrate God's healing power in our lives through the 12 Steps and 8 Recovery Principles. This experience allows us to "be changed." We open the door by sharing our experiences, strengths and hopes with one another. In addition, we become willing to accept God's grace in solving our lives' problems. By working and applying these Biblical principles, we begin to grow spiritually. We become free from our addictive, compulsive, and dysfunctional behaviors. This freedom creates peace, serenity, joy, and most importantly, a strong personal relationship with God and others. As we progress through the program we discover our personal, loving and forgiving Higher Power -- Jesus Christ.

"Since starting Celebrate Recovery my life is no longer dark and hopeless. God is doing amazing things and changing me in ways I couldn't have imagined and giving me new hope. He has shown me things about myself I didn't even know and used those teachings to heal me and set me free."

"Thus far, Celebrate Recovery has indeed taught me this thing called "Christianity" is most certainly NOT about perfection. I am learning that Christianity is not about being perfect nor coming from the perfect family. It's not about having the perfect marriage nor perfect children. It's not about performing perfectly at a job, being the perfect mom, nor keeping a perfect house. No. Christianity is about imperfection. About messing up. It's about Confession. Forgiveness. Repentance. Redemption. Healing. Freedom. Freedom from my past. Freedom from the guilt of my sin. Freedom through change. True freedom."

"I have been clean from porn ever since that first day of recovery. The road to recovery has not been easy but every inch of ground I have traveled has been more than worth it. I have come to realize what that deep repentance really is. It is like a healing hurt. The painful experience of honestly facing my demons, myself, and a Holy God has been purifying."



"When I finally came to CR, I found a community of people willing to support me. I was no longer struggling alone. The tools I gained helped me to honestly look at my life and the patterns that shaped my belief system, and thus my actions. I was

able to begin the process of forgiving myself and others, freeing me from the chains that kept me bound in fear and isolation."

How has your ministry area linked with our vision of "Building Generations for Jesus Christ?"

Men and women who carry hurts, habits and hang-ups will not grow very much. They (we) need healing and freedom in order to be "built up" and serve effectively. Celebrate Recovery is an avenue of healing and freedom so that believers can go on and serve more effectively and bear fruit for the kingdom that will last!

How has your ministry area reached, touched or changed the world and supported our mission to Love, Live & Lead like Jesus?

Jesus came to heal the brokenhearted and bind up their wounds (Psalm 147:3; Isaiah 61:1). He tenderly cares for us in our struggles and boldly challenges us to take up our bed and walk! Every person who takes advantage of what can be experienced through Celebrate Recovery is changed by intentionally putting the teachings of Jesus into practice and learning to rely on Him to do the impossible!

How have volunteers supported your ministry area(s)?

A faithful crew of volunteers serve tirelessly week in and week out. Some come early and stay late for set up and tear down. Some help with the weekly meal prior to the recovery meetings. Some serve as facilitators of small groups. Some serve as sponsors and accountability partners. Some wear many of the aforementioned hats. Bottom line is this: volunteers are essential to what we do at Celebrate Recovery!

GriefShare HIGHLIGHTS





GriefShare is a ministry that specializes in helping those who have lost someone they love cope with the reality of their loss.

Griefshare is facilitated by Dannette McInturff, who has experienced the heartache of losing someone she loves.

Griefshare meets two different times throughout the year for 13 week sessions. One session is in the fall and the other is in winter/spring.

The highlights of GriefShare are hard to explain except in this: The pain of grieving slowly but surely lessens over a long period of time as participants learn to face a "new normal".

Sometimes "Generations" have to take time to heal from their losses. Losing a parent, spouse, child or close friend hurts. GriefShare facilitates a healing process to ease the pain of loss.

God heals the brokenhearted and binds up their wounds (Psalm 147:3). He is the God of all comfort who comforts us in all our sorrows (II Corinthians 1:3-4). The caring volunteers at GriefShare share in the sorrows and share the comfort they have received and thus extend the love of Jesus to those who are grieving.

How have volunteers supported your ministry area(s)?



One of the highlights of each year is our Be Generous Campaign. For two years we have purchased Christmas presents for teens in foster care through the House of New Hope. This past year we donated funds to the Licking County Food Pantry and donated funds to Northfork School district for incentive initiatives in Utica Middle School. This opened the door for Pastor Jeff to begin meeting with three middle school youth every Monday during their lunch hour. God has reopened that door for the 2019 – 2020 school year as well! This year we will be supporting Glory Reins Stables in Utica where they use horses who have their own stories of abandonment and abuse to come along side of children and teens who have experienced trauma in their lives. The generosity of the folks at our Utica Campus has overflowed in that for the first two years of our Be Generous

Campaigns they have given over \$13,000 to assist agencies in Utica do what they do.

A team of 8 from primarily the Utica campus (two came along from the Granville campus) travelled to Whiteville, North Carolina to work with Samaritan's Purse in the effort to rebuild and repair homes damaged by Hurricane Florence. This was the first mission experience consisting primarily of men, women and youth from our Utica Campus.

2018 – 2019 was also a year of upgrades and additions to our physical plant. We added a new playground put in by volunteers, remodeled our worship platform, also done by volunteers. A generous donor from the Granville campus donated time and materials to create a two lane entrance to our parking lot.





How has your ministry area linked with our vision of "Building Generations for Jesus Christ?"

In the course of our first 2 1/2 years, we have built relationships with families that span the generations. God has brought together families with young children, youth and young adults. There are also men and women in their 50's, 60's and 70's who participate regularly in the ministries of Spring Hills Utica.






